Personal, Social, Emotional Development

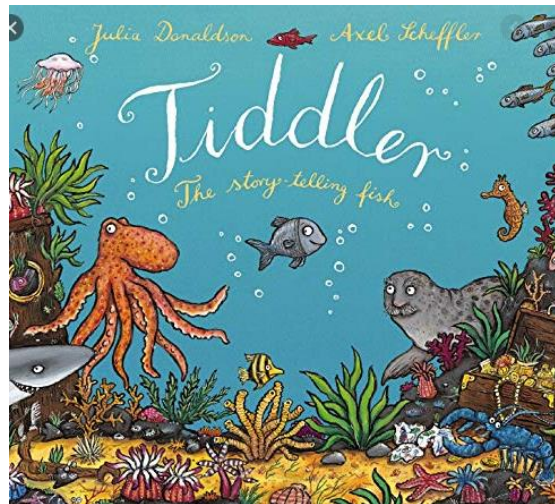
- Look at the images from the book and discuss what Tiddler is doing. Talk about the shark's mean face and the fierce turtle biting the squid. Do you think that Tiddler was frightened by these creatures? Emphasise that it is safe and fun to make up stories about scary things.
- What do you think a goldfish needs to be looked after?



Maths

- Can you complete the daily maths sheets based on more sea farers The Night Pirates?

- Watch some Numberblocks episodes
- Have a go at an activity on Mathletics
- What times are mentioned in the story? Are there any clocks in the illustrations? What times do they show?



Literacy

- Visit the Ruth Miskin website and watch a video on any of the sounds you need to practise. The schedule for this half term is here.
- Use Oxford Owl to practise your reading.
- Read a variety of books.

- Interactive Games on [Phonics Play](#) Enter the details that appear on the home screen to enter.
- Get your grown up to write 'Sorry I was late' and then finish the sentence thinking of where Tiddler could have gone to. Can you draw a picture of his tall tale too?

- Write a story about Tiddler riding somewhere on a seahorse. Where does he go to? What happens there?



Tiddler

Communication and Language

- Explain that Tiddler is a little fish 'with a big imagination'. Talk about what this means.
- Can you think of some other reasons that might cause Tiddler to be late? Who else might he meet or where else might he end up? Maybe Tiddler was chased by a purple spotted shark, or swirled and whorled in a bubbly whirlpool. Can you come up with fun and descriptive tales.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Can you spot the 'Gruffalo' fish in the illustrations? Can you design your own fish based on a character from a popular story?
- Can you make a model of a fish, like this one, or design your own?



- Cut out a starfish shape and design a cool pattern on it!



- Make an underwater picture using anything you like!



Physical Development

- Can you re-enact Tiddler's events using expressive movement, for example,

wriggling out of the squid's tentacles or flapping around in the fishermen's net.

Understanding the World

- Can you complete a task on Purple Mash
- Can you find out a fact about fish from a book or on the Internet?
- Look on a map and find different seas and oceans around the world.
- Find the locations of ponds / rivers / streams near to where you live. Could you go to visit?
