#### **Childcare for 2 year olds**

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From 2 January 2024, eligible working parents can apply for 15 hours of childcare for their two-year-old. Parents have until 31 March 2024 to apply for a code, with mid-January to the end of February being the optimum time to apply in case they need to provide further information to support their application.

To apply for a childcare code each parent needs to be working and earning the equivalent of 16 hours a week at national minimum/living wage and under £100,000 adjusted net income per year. This means that each parent needs to earn from just over £8,600 per year to be eligible for 15 hours a week of childcare during term time.

There is more information on the childcare support available to parents on the <u>Childcare Choices</u> website, where you can explore the early education entitlements and other government help with childcare costs.

### School Lunch price increase from 01.01.2024

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Due to increased costs, the price of a school lunch will be increasing to £2.75. The price of a Friday bacon bap and a drink will also be increasing to £1.60.

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#### **School Attendance**

Dear Parent, our overall school attendance figures are in the <u>bottom 20% of schools in England</u> and this does not take into consideration COVID related absence which does not affect attendance figures.

These high level of absences are mainly due to a marked increase in term time holidays and other unauthorised absences. I have noticed a marked increase in the number of parents requesting term time holiday absence. With the tough couple of years we have all experienced, I can fully appreciate the temptation to take your child out of school during term time for a holiday or even a long weekend. The school cannot authorise term time absence for holidays even if the reason is given for the parents' work schedules or family commitments. Term time absence has an undoubted negative impact on your child's learning.

If they miss even just a day or two of learning in school your child will miss:

An important chunk of a genre writing sequence that will be taking place in their English lessons which will be hard to catch them up on.

An important next step in a maths lesson that is related to a method in the previous lesson and connected to the next lesson in a step-by-step progressive manner.

Lessons related to our topic work (connected curriculum) that are planned out in a way for the children to make connections in their learning by building on prior knowledge.

Infants will miss an important phonics sound (Grapheme or Phoneme) which has been planned out carefully to happen in a progressive manner.

Juniors will miss an important spelling pattern that will be focused on during the spelling lessons that week.

#### **RCSAT Attendance Notification**

What the law says about school attendance:

The law requires all children between the ages of 5 and 16 to be in full time education.

Under Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 it is the duty of the parent/carer of a child of compulsory school age to ensure that they attend school regularly.

Supervision Order Children's Act 1989: The local authority can apply to the courts where attendance remains poor. A named education supervisor would be appointed to work with the family for up to 12 months to ensure the young person receives full time education.

School Attendance Order Education Act 1996: If this is issued; parents would be directed to register their child at a school named by the local authority.

Penalty Notice: A warning letter can be issued when a pupil has had 10 or more unauthorised absences from school. The warning letter gives parents a period of 15 days of monitoring. If at the end of this period there has not been an improvement or an improvement has been made but not sustained, a Penalty Notice will be issued. Each parent/carer would have to pay £60.00 per child. If this is not paid within 21 days, the payment increases to £120.00 per child per parent. Payments will not be accepted after 28 days. If parents do not pay, the Local Authority will prosecute in the Magistrates' Court. If convicted the parent will have a criminal record and may receive a fine of up to £1000.

The Department for Education have a range of information available regarding attendance.

#### Why attendance at School and Punctuality is important

98% attendance means your child has missed 4 days in the school year 95% attendance means that your child has missed 10 days in the school year 90% attendance means that your child has missed 19 days in the school year 80% attendance means that your child has missed 38 days in the school year 5 minutes late each day means 3 whole days lost each year 17 days missed from school each year equates to a whole GCSE grade Attendance affects learning, future earning, wellbeing and a sense of belonging
