## Mrs McDonough's Messages

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week in our Collective Worship we have been continuing to focus on our Christian Value of the half term 'Thankfulness'. I shared with the children a story about seeking happiness and we talked about a good way to seek happiness is to seek it in the Lord. We said 'If you're happy in God, you've got lasting happiness'. We show thankful worship often through song, and we have been learning several songs recently about being thankful for food and our harvest. We look forward to sharing some of these with you at our Harvest Service next month.

#### Kitchen Closed 26/9/24

We have found out today that Karen won't be in school from Thursday 26th September for at least a week, but most likely two weeks. She is going into hospital for a planned procedure and we include her in our prayers and wish her a speedy recovery! Cheshire Catering are unable to send us a cook so we will be delivered a 'cold dispatch' daily from a neighbouring school. This will be sandwich/picnic bags. These will be ordered daily.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

I have seen a number of children starting to wear trainers again instead of school shoes. Please can I remind parents and pupils that children must wear black shoes on days where they wear uniform, and trainers on PE days. We also now have a large number of pre-loved and new uniform in school available for a donation to school fund. We will run a sale every Friday this half term (weather permitting!) outside the main door. We are only able to take cash currently for uniform. If you have any uniform at home that your child has grown out of, including PE kits, jumpers and blazers, we would love to have them and help them find a new home.

#### <u>Attendance</u>

There has been lots of information in the press again and a few parents have spoken to me about holidays in term time. Our policies across the trust have been revised following guidance from the Government. It is important to note that holidays during term time will no longer be authorised. Any holidays in term time will be given a 'G' (unauthorised leave) code in the registers. These are reviewed half termly by the Local Authority and may trigger a fine from Cheshire East LA.

#### Macmillan Coffee Morning—Friday 27th September 8.45am-11am

Our Ethos team have been busy today planning for our Macmillan coffee morning next week. They are asking for donations for our coffee morning to raise funds for such a wonderful cause.
