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Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>School obtained School's Games Mark Gold for inter and intra school's games and competition involvement. This was due to the school attending and increased variety and number of competitive sports competitions through the CNSPP alliance.</p> <p>Huge success of introducing After School Dance and Drama into the extra-curricula options with Miss Finch running Stage Stars for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2.
